

Enhancing Community Care for Ontarians (ECCO) 3.0

What is ECCO?

Enhancing Community Care for Ontarians (ECCO) calls on government and health system partners to strengthen community care and anchor the health system in primary care to better meet the health needs of all Ontarians. First released in 2012 and next in 2014, ECCO 3.0 aligns with much needed health system transformation that responds to the COVID-19 pandemic.


Bill 175: Connecting People to Home and Community Care Act, 2020

16 RECOMMENDATIONS



RNAO's written submission sent to the Committee on June 17, 2020

Long-Term Care Systemic Failings

- Serious understaffing, including lack of regulated staffing to meet increasing acuity
- Inadequate infection prevention and control
- Challenging behavioural responses (responsive behaviours) to lack of staff support
- Lack of support for staff and poor staff morale
- Financial disincentive to improve resident outcomes

Staffing Solution Needed

- July 31, 2020 is an important date on the government's calendar
- It's the deadline Justice Eileen Gillese gave the government to table in the legislature a detailed report on the adequacy of regulated staffing in LTC. It was a key recommendation in her report The Long-Term Care Homes Public Inquiry (2019).



RNAO Solution: Nursing Home Basic Care Guarantee Staffing Formula

- Each resident shall receive four (4) worked hours of direct nursing and personal care each day (within 24 hrs), as follows:
 - 48 minutes of RN care (regulated)
 - 60 minutes of RPN care (regulated)
 - 132 minutes of PSW care (unregulated)
- In addition, each nursing home should have one (1) NP per 120 residents in the role of Attending NP or Director of Clinical Care, and
- One (1) full-time RN specializing in infection prevention and control.

RNAO Solution: Nursing Home Basic Care Guarantee Stabilizing the LTC Work Force

Mandate and fund the following human resource policies:

- Permit staff to work in only one LTC facility
- Compensation that is equal to those employed by hospitals
- Full-time employment with benefits to staff who want full time work to enable continuity of care for residents, improve staff retention, and remove the need to work in multiple locations.


