

ABSTRACT

An IEN Pathway Program was created to provide structured support, assessments, and resources for the IENs to safely transition into independent practice.



METHODS

- ☐ Program went through a series of 3 PDSA cycle to test and enhance the tools and resources.
- ☐ After each cycle, IENs who have been chosen to be in the program were interviewed to understand it's impact to the IENs' confidence to practice

FINDINGS





BACKGROUND

The number of IENs registered in Ontario reached 5,491 in 2023, a 3.5-fold increase over four years (College of Nurses of Ontario, 2024). In 2024, 25-50% of new hires at UHN are Internationally Educated Nurses (IENs), with 71% having less than one year of experience in Ontario. An environmental scan identified gaps in courses and clinical preparation for IENs.





MATERIALS

- ☐ The pathway program enhanced IENs' knowledge, skills, and behavior, increasing their confidence in independent practice and overall well-being.
- ☐ Starting January 2025, the IEN Pathway is now available across various programs at UHN hospital sites. Educators will receive support and coaching to ensure the successful transition of IENs into practice.
- ☐ Future work includes creation of IEN Orientation day to support clinical judgment and clinical reasoning through cognitive, affective, and psychomotor learning.
