





Evidence-Based practice Attitude and Utilization Survey (EBASE)

Tool's Purpose

The Evidence-Based practice Attitude and Utilization Survey (EBASE) investigates complementary and alternative medicine (CAM) practitioners' attitudes, skills, and use of EBP, and the barriers and facilitators that can influence the adoption of EBP (Leach & Gilham, 2008).

Brief Tool Description

- 84 items scored either by four- or five- point Likert scales or categorical response sets as indicated below. Seven parts:
 - Part A (clinicians' opinion of evidence-based practice (EBP)): 5-point Likert scale
 (9 items)
 - o Part B (self-reported practitioner skills in EBP): 5-point Likert scale (13 items)
 - Part C (clinicians' level of training in five EBP-related areas): Select all that applies (5 items)
 - Part D (percentage of practice based on clinical research and sources of information that influence clinical decision-making): 5-point Likert scale & Ranking (20 items)
 - o Part E (barriers to EBP): 4-point Likert scale (13 items)
 - o Part F (facilitators to EBP): 4-point Likert scale (10 items)
 - o Part G (respondents demographics) (14 items)

Knowledge to Action Framework Phase(s):

- Assess barriers/facilitators to knowledge use
- Monitor knowledge use
