





Evidence-based Nursing Attitude Questionnaire (EBNAQ)

Tool's Purpose

The Evidence-based Nursing Attitude Questionnaire (EBNAQ) measures nurses' attitudes towards EBNP according to their beliefs, feelings, and intentions to conduct EBN practice. The EBNAQ was initially developed to be used in Spanish-speaking contexts (Ruzafa-Martínez et al., 2011).

Brief Tool Description

- 15 items, scored on a 5-point Likert scale. Three factors:
 - Beliefs and expectations towards evidence-based nursing practice (EBNP) (7 items)
 - Intention to conduct EBNP (4 items)
 - Feelings toward EBNP (4 items)

Knowledge to Action Framework Phase(s):

- Assess barriers/facilitators to knowledge use
- Monitor knowledge use
